CAFES to Host Oct. 29 Forum with California Department of Food and Agriculture Secretary

Karen Ross, secretary of the California Department of Food and Agriculture, will give a keynote presentation from 11 a.m. to noon Thursday, Oct. 29, in Chumash Auditorium. Ross will talk about the issues facing California agriculture today, including climate change, water and innovative technologies, healthy soils and waste management. A question-and-answer session will follow. Ross has strengthened partnerships across government, academia and the nonprofit sector in the drive to maintain and improve environmental stewardship and to develop adaptation strategies for the specific impacts of climate change. She has initiated programs to provide more opportunities for farmers and ranchers to engage in sustainable environmental stewardship practices, including water conservation, energy efficiency, nutrient management and ecosystem services. The campus community is encouraged to attend.

Help Cal Poly Athletics Break Attendance Record for Women's Soccer
