Researchers Honored for a Record \$32 Million in Grants in 2015-16

Faculty and staff who received a record \$32 million in grants and whose research resulted in five patents for the university in the 2015-16 academic year were honored at an Oct. 27 award reception. "I just want to say how proud I am of the work that you are all doing," said Dean Wendt, dean of research in the Office of Research and Economic Development, to some 80 faculty and staff members gathered at the annual reception. "We are celebrating an unprecedented year of externally funded research activity at the university." Funding for new grant awards was up by 20 percent over last year, and "ranks as the highest amount of external funding on record at Cal Poly," Wendt added. Research grants also had these benefits, he said: paid more than \$250,000 in tuition, fees and scholarships for students; purchased more than \$650,000 in lab equipment; supported the wages of 58 employees through the Cal Poly Corporation; and paid \$1.8 million in wages to more than 800 students. President Armstrong was impressed with the faculty who apply for the grants and the staff who administer them. "You are impacting lives," he said. "You are helping students succeed. And your careers are just blossoming and growing. It's very, very exciting."
