Cal Poly Pier in Avila Beach Open to Tours on Oct. 29

Bring the family and tour the Cal Poly Pier in Avila Beach from 9 a.m. to noon Saturday, Oct. 29. The fall open house will feature hands-on touch tanks full of live marine creatures, microscopes for viewing ultra-small sea creatures, and lots of interactive displays on the pier that is more than a half-mile long. Kids can put their faces in the water and breathe through a scuba respirator, learn why whales migrate and discover what a red tide is. Faculty and students will be available to answer questions. Safety rules require closed-toe walking shoes to walk on the pier. It is on Avila Beach Drive, just west of the San Luis Creek Bridge. Parking is limited near the pier, so visitors should use the public parking lots in Avila Beach and walk to the pier.
