Cal Poly has been named a 2017 best-value college by Kiplinger's Personal Finance, placing 21st in the nation and fourth in the state among public universities and colleges on the magazine's annual ranking. Kiplinger's ranked the top 300 best-value colleges and universities that "offer the best bang for your educational buck" from data culled from nearly 1,200 public and private four-year institutions across the nation. Cal Poly also ranked 98th overall, among both public and private institutions. Its standings in the top 25 nationally and top four in California make this the university's best showing in the list that the magazine said provides a quality education at an affordable price.
